Supplies Needed

- Chipboard
- Tumbled Glass Pieces
- Sculpey III Oven-Bake Clay
- Bar Pin
- Pencil
- Household Oven or Toaster Oven
- Glue Gun
- Craft Knife
- Modeling Tool
- Sealer (Optional)

Tumbled Glass Pin Project Kit

50-Project Set—Enough supplies for 50 students to make a Tumbled Glass Pin. Includes three 20 oz. packages of Diamond Tech tumbled glass, one 25-count package of 6x6" Grafix chipboard, four 2 oz. packages of black Sculpey III Oven-Bake Clay, 50 bar pins and instruction sheet. You will also need pencils, craft knives, modeling tools, a glue gun and access to an oven to finish the pins. Sculpey III Oven-Bake Clay is AP Seal, non-toxic.

Step 1

Cut a piece of chipboard in half or quarters, depending on the size you desire. Select several pieces of tumbled glass and arrange them on the chipboard.



Step 2

Trace around glass shape and cut out the chipboard with a craft knife.



Step 3

Trim the chipboard so that the glass pieces hang off the edge slightly. Use a glue gun to attach the glass pieces.



Step 4

Instead of grout, press a small amount of black Sculpey III Oven Bake Clay between the gaps with a modeling tool. Bake the pin according to instructions on the Sculpey package.

Step 5

Attach a bar pin to the back of the chipboard with a glue gun.

Optional Step

Optional: Seal with Krylon Crystal Clear Acrylic Coating Spray to protect the glass and make it shiny.
